MARCH 14, 2019**

Dave Schauer, Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the following present: Douglas Goode, Cam Collins, John Mirosh and Tracy Pincus also present were Greg Harris, Chief Couzens, Jim Bonebrake, Rob Fitzpatrick, Terry Fitzpatrick, Ruth May, Alan Burton, Martha Burton, Darren Curry, Beth Curry, Mike Gassman, Corey Wilkinson, Anthony Prausa, Jacob Lloyd, Roger Porter and JW Lile.

Dave Schauer led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Schauer presented Proclamation for Plattsburg High School Boys Basketball Team.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Comment made about fixing road at N main and 116 Hwy and response was Mo-Dot Fixing it.

Consent Agenda is approved.

Resolution-

For Bobcat Lease with Wells Fargo. 4 Ayes and 2 Absent.

Bill No. 1394 an ordinance authorizing the city administrator to enter into a contract with Visu-Sewer to rehabilitate 7,537 feet of damaged sanitary sewer mains. Cam Collins made a motion for the first read. Seconded by Tracy Pincus. John Mirosh made a motion for the second read, seconded by Doug Goode. Mayor Schauer polled with the following results: Clyde May Absent, Doug Goode YES, Cam Collins Absent, Ken Tongue Absent, Tracy Pincus YES and John Mirosh YES. **Therefore Bill No. 1394 became Ordinance No 2358.**

Public Comment for Bill No. 1395 and 1396:

Jacob Lloyd 304 Railroad south of property. He expressed didn't want in his backyard. No benefit and feels like this is being pushed thru. Property has been Ag liked living with nothing behind him and feels like nothing will stop noise.

Anthony Prausa 801 N Main and 200 Patricia opposes both ordinances.

Mike Gassman 1304 N Y Hwy. Opposes the ordinances. Traffic is busy enough Y hwy already has Grain trucks, com trucks and school buses running on it. Unfair for area to have to put up with more noise and dust. A lot of Equipment for the area. North main will be tore up as well if road goes thru property. Commissioners need to look around current site for land to expand.

Corey Wilkinson Property Owner. 20 acres was in City Plan to be light industrial. Special Road District Runs 7:30 to 4:30 M-T. He isn't getting rich on deal it makes sense to him.

Roger Porter property owner on N Main St and Y Hwy. Each council member represents a section Of the City and he is against re-zoning.

Greg Harris informed council Commissioners did ask land owners. Land is neighbor's property not your Backyard. Traffic will increase some. Revenue is not a windfall but will go up. Nobody has tried to trick Anyone. Roads get tore up by the "Freeze Thaw Cycle".

John Mirosh Ward 1 point out three things: Overwhelming opposition. Planning and Zoning Board voted No. None of the County Commissioners that applied for both ordinances showed up to this meeting.

Mayor Schauer said at the Planning and Zoning meeting they discussed No access to N Main St., They would have to finish 400 feet of road and private fencing.

Mayor Schauer then said to council you have the option Agree, Disagree or Table it.

Bill No. 1395: an ordinance amending the zoning of 20 acres located at 400 mid America drive and 800 N Main from A-G Agriculture to I-1 Industrial. - TABLED

Roger Porter property owner on N Main St and Y Hwy. Wouldn't they have to hook up to City sewer? Why don't they hook up to Nick's Healthcare? They are hooked with Nick's Healthcare And it has issues. Sewer is available main sewer there at Main, 4th street or at Truss Plant.

Corey Wilkinson property owner. If they build an 80-bed facility it will be the largest Utility User for the City in his opinion.

Mayor Schauer then said to council you have the option Agree, Disagree or Table it

Bill No. 1396: an ordinance approving a special use permit for the construction of a Law Enforcement facility at 801 N Main St. - TABLED

Bill No. 1397: an ordinance awarding the contract to repair 7 sewer point repairs. John Mirosh made a motion for the first read. Seconded by Cam Collins. Doug Goode made a motion for the second read, seconded by Tracy Pincus. Mayor Schauer polled with the following results: Tracy Pincus YES, John Mirosh YES, Ken Tongue Absent, Cam Collins YES, Doug Goode YES, and Clyde May Absent. **Therefore Bill No. 1397 became Ordinance No 2359.**

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Mayor Schauer reviewed Salary for the New Council is at 300.00 for Council and 600.00 for Mayor. Recommending raise to 400.00 Council and 800.00 Mayor. City of Lawson is 1200.00 Council and 1800.00 Mayor. Mayor asked them to entertain this followed by 4 ayes and 2 absent.

Mayor Schauer went on to discuss 3 small communities Lathrop, Gower and Plattsburg. We need to help each other out. Mayor asks city council to get everyone together for a meal at community courtyard to swap ideas. Council was in agreement.

There being no further business to discuss, Cam Collins seconded by Doug Goode, made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. 4 Ayes and 2 Absent.

City Administrator's Report

April 2019

Greg Harris

United Fiber:

We turned in 494 sign-ups to United Fiber. They are going through them to qualify the addresses. We had forms turned in from people that do not live in Plattsburg. We had forms submitted from Lathrop and Cameron and several from outside the city limits.

Perkins lift station:

Excavation and backfilling are complete. The concrete work is done and the pumping unit is set. We will begin construction on the new building this week.

Water System:

We had a single boil advisory this month. It was caused by a drop in pressure due to the replacement of the flow meter at the water plant.

Sewer Lining:

Visu-sewer was here last week to prepare the sewer mains for lining. The crew that does the lining installation should be here in the next few weeks.

Miscellaneous:

I completed and submitted the permit application for our wastewater treatment plant with the Department of Natural Resources. The permitting is on a five-year cycle and ours is due for renewal in September.

The County Commission has withdrawn their application for the rezone of the property at the end of Mid-America Drive and for the special use permit for a law enforcement center.

The Consumer Confidence Report on our water system (2018) is available.

The Mayor and I attended the Chamber of Commerce luncheon and gave a presentation of the happenings in Plattsburg.

We have installed a new scoreboard at the baseball field.

The Mayor and I met with a representative of the U.S. Census Bureau about the upcoming 2020 census.

SECTION ONE: The City hereby certifies the outcome of the April 2, 2019 municipal election as certified by the Clinton County Clerk.


