



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, PLATTSBURG, CITY OF (the "Lessee") is a validly existing political subdivision of the State of MO (the "State"), existing as such under and by virtue of the Constitution, statutes and laws of the State;

WHEREAS, the ADMINISTRATOR of the Lessee (the "Governing Body") has the power under the laws of the State to lease or purchase personal property for use by the Lessee; and the Governing Body has determined, and hereby determines, that it is in the best interests of the Lessee to enter into a Municipal Lease Agreement with BERRY COMPANIES INC ("Lessor") which lease will be assigned to Wells Fargo Vendor Financial Services, LLC ("Assignee") pursuant to an assignment by Lessor to Assignee (such Municipal Lease Agreement and Assignment are herein together referred to as the "Lease") for the purpose of financing the acquisition of the equipment (the "Equipment") described in Exhibit A to the Lease, and that the use of such Equipment is essential to the Lessee's proper, efficient and economic operation;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has taken the necessary and appropriate steps under applicable law, including, without limitation, any public bidding requirements, to arrange for the acquisition and financing of the Equipment under the Lease;

WHEREAS, the Lease terminates, and the Lessee's obligations thereunder are extinguished, if the Governing Body fails to appropriate money for the ensuring fiscal year for the payment of the amounts due in such fiscal year;

WHEREAS, there has been presented to the Governing Body the form of the Lease, including Exhibit A thereto, which the Lessee proposes to approve, enter into and deliver, as applicable, to effectuate the proposed financing of the Equipment; and it appears that the Lease and its Exhibit A are in appropriate form and are appropriate instruments for the purposes intended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all actions of the Lessee in effectuating the Lease are hereby approved, ratified and authorized pursuant to and in accordance with the transactions contemplated by the Lease.

Section 2. That sums be and hereby are allocated from the budget of the Governing Body for the fiscal year ending on Fy 2023 sufficient to meet all obligations of the Lessee under the Lease, including without limitation Monthly Rent in the amount of \$1,385.34 per month.

Section 3. The Governing Body hereby approves the acquisition by the Lessee of the Equipment described in Exhibit A to the Lease, such acquisition to be financed by Lessor/Assignee pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the Lease, which will be a valid, legal and binding obligation of the Lessee enforceable in accordance with its terms. The form and content of the Lease are in all respects authorized, approved and confirmed and the ADMINISTRATOR of the Lessee, or his designee is authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver the Lease and the other Documents (as defined in the Lease) for and on behalf of the Lessee in substantially the form attached hereto, but with such changes, modifications, additions or deletions therein as shall to him seem necessary, desirable or appropriate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this Resolution take effect from and after its passage.

Whereas, the City has identified 7,537 feet of sanitary sewer with multiple defects;


NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Plattsburg that:

Dear Planning Commission,

In the matter of the amendment to zoning request by the Clinton County Commission of the tract of land located at 400 mid America Drive/800 N. Main St.:

The change in classification would be consistent with the intent and purpose of the City of Plattsburg's policies, programs, ordinances, rules and regulations. The property in question was originally part of the planned industrial park and rezoning the property to I-1 Light Industrial would provide for a continuation of the existing industrial area.

The proposed use of the property would be permitted if it were reclassified and that it would be compatible with the uses permitted on the properties in the immediate vicinity.

The property has adequate utility service for the proposed use. Sewer, water, and natural gas are readily available at the location. Proper road access is also available.

The proposed amendment is necessary due to changing conditions in the area. As Clinton County has grown, so have the needs of County Road and Bridge and County law Enforcement. The current facilities have grown in-adequate in size with no room for expansion at their current locations. The proposed amendment would not provide a disproportionately greater loss to individual landowners relative to public gain.

With these factors in mind the City of Plattsburg Zoning Administrator recommends the approval of the request of the Clinton County Commission to amend the zoning of the parcel from "A-G" Agriculture to "I-1" Light Industrial contingent upon the Road and Bridge facility having access to Y Highway from Mid-America Drive.

Dear Planning Commission,

In the matter of the request for a special use permit by the Clinton County Commission to build and operate a law enforcement center consisting of a facility for corrections, public order and safety, and police protection at 800 N Main:

The location and size of the proposed use the property at 800 N Main St. would not conflict with adjacent properties and their uses. The property would be in an area located in the industrial park. This parcel was originally part of the industrial park when the industrial park was originally platted.

The property would have easily accessibility to police, fire, refuse collection, and other municipal services. There would be adequate ingress and egress to and within the site. There would be adequate off-street parking and loading areas.

The property has adequate utility service for the proposed use. Sewer, water, electricity and natural gas are readily available at the location. Proper road access is also available.

There are natural tree lines in place to provide screening from residential areas for the proposed use. The size of the property also allows for distance as a buffer. The location, height, and nature of the buildings would be acceptable with these factors in place.

There is adequate open space on the property for the proposed use.

As the property is located in an industrial area, it would be compatible with adjacent property use.

With these factors in mind the City of Plattsburg Zoning Administrator recommends the approval of the request for a special use permit in the above stated matter with the following caveat:

1. Installation of a screening device on the sanitary sewer service line designed to collect non-sewerage solids.



Water Plant inspection by DNR:

We received our report on the water plant inspection from DNR. The only items that were out of compliance were a few screens over air reliefs and overflow pipes that had tears in them. They have been replaced.

Sanitary Sewer Collection System Inspection:

We received our report on the sanitary sewer collection system. There were no items found to be out of compliance. The report did include some recommendations. These include reducing our I&I, and raising sewer rates.

Public Works:

Several meters froze this month during the cold snap.

We have also used a great deal of salt on the roads as well as overtime to push snow. Pray for spring.

We had one water leak to repair this month. It was on a Sunday night during the cold. Hats off to Public Works on this one.

United Fiber:

We have the sign-ups at City Hall. We are six weeks in and we have collected 350. We sent a mailer out with utility bills this month. Please continue to help spread the word.

Perkins lift station:

The project continues. Our new wet well has been installed and backfilling has begun.

Miscellaneous:

We have closed on the sale of the property at Mid America Drive.

We have the final engineering report for the water line upgrades. It has been submitted to DNR for approval. We are still a long way from breaking ground, but progressing. I have received news that we qualify to compete for a \$500,000 Community Development Block Grant for water systems. When the time comes, we will submit the necessary information.

I submitted the biannual I&I report to DNR.

I attended the North Central Missouri Business Facilitators Annual Meeting.
